QUESTIONS FOR POSSIBLE FIELD PARTNERS

- 1. Briefly describe the program or intervention that you are interested in studying. Specifically, upon whom or what does it operate? How does it work? Who does what to or for whom?
- 2. Who are the key players (organizations or individuals) in this program or intervention?
- 3. Let us know what your case volume is for this program or intervention. How many people do you serve in this program in a given month or in a specific six month period (pick a recent time period that represents your current case volume)? How many people request services but are turned away or placed on a wait list? Provide as much detail as you can regarding the type of service, area(s) of law, geography, etc.
- 4. How do you decide who is eligible to receive services through your program or intervention? That is, how do you decide who gets services vs. who is placed on a wait list or turned away?
- 5. Is there a clear moment at which similarly situated people could be routed to one of two or more study groups?
- 6. What outcomes are you hoping to measure? Think about the goals of the program or intervention. What is it supposed to accomplish?
